FAVORITES

Not only have hydrangeas grown in popularity but also in selection. In Manitoba hydrangeas come in a variety of colors, shapes, and sizes. There are some that prefer shade, but many that will thrive in the sun. Perfect to fill a garden area and bring inside as a beautiful cut or dried flower. Gardeners and florists prize them for their beautiful blooms.



PANICULATA

Blooms on new wood, Prune late fall or early spring, Full to Part Sun

- Bobo - 3-4 ft, white flowers
- Bombshell 2-3ft, white flowers
- Fire and Ice - 4-5ft, white and pink flowers
- Firelight - 4-5 ft, white and pink flowers
- Limelight - 6-7ft, white to lime green flowers
- Little Lime - 3-4ft, white to lime green flowers
- Little Lamb - 4-5ft, white flowers
- Pinky Winky - 6-7ft, white fading to deep pink
- Quick Fire - 6-7ft, pink to rich rose
- Little Quick Fire - 2.5-3.5ft, pink to rich rose
- Vanilla Strawberry - 5-6ft
- Phantom - 5-6ft

ARBORESCENS

Blooms on new wood, prune late fall or early spring, Part Sun to Dappled Sun.

- Annabelle - 4-5ft high, white flowers
- Incrediball - 4-5 ft high, white flowers
- Invincibelle - 3-4 ft high, pink flowers

MACROPHYLLA

Blooms on old and new wood, do not prune, Partial shade to full sun.

- Endless Summer - 3-4ft, deep pink with blue overtones
- Bloomstruck - 3-4ft, rose pink to purple

Note: Soil needs to be amended regularly with Aluminum Sulphate to intensify color.

CLIMBING HYDRANGEA

One of the most sought-after climbers, this vine makes an excellent flowering cover for vertical structures and trees and can also be used as a groundcover; attractive white lace cap-like flowers in mid-summer and clean foliage; a self-clinging vine. Can grow up to 20 feet high. Does better in sheltered locations to protect it from our winter.
