Ninebarks have a colorful foliage that emerges in mid-spring, lasting well into fall. Clusters of pink or white flowers appear early summer, followed by decorative seed heads. Once the leaves have dropped, the exfoliating bark adds winter interest. They thrive in full sun, to part shade conditions. They will bloom more in full sun.



FAVORITES

Amber Jubilee Ninebark

- Matures at 5'-6' high and wide
- New growth is orange
- Fall color is purple
- A cross between a Diablo and a Dart's Gold

Coppertina Ninebark

- Matures at 5'-6' high and wide
- New growth is an attractive copper color
- Foliage turns red in the summer

Dart's Gold Ninebark

- Matures at 5'-6' high and wide
- Bright golden foliage
- Very hardy shrub with a great color

Tiny Gold Ninebark

- Matures at 3'-4' high and wide
- Brilliant yellow new growth
- White/Pink flower clusters in June



Diablo Ninebark

- Matures at 5'-6' high and wide
- Dark purple foliage all season
- White flower cluster

Summer Wine Ninebark

- Matures at 4'-5' high and wide
- Dark crimson red foliage
- Pinkish-white flower clusters

Centerglow Ninebark

- Matures at 5'-6' high and wide
- New Growth is a golden color
- Foliage turns a burgundy color

Summerwine Black Ninebark

- Matures at 5'-6' high and wide
- Foliage is a dark purple, black
- Clusters of white-pink blooms

Ginger Wine Ninebark

- Matures at 5'-6' high and wide
- New growth is sunny orange, then turns burgundy
- Clusters of white-pink blooms

Royal Jubilee Ninebark

- Matures at 3'-4' high and wide
- Deep dark purple leaves
- Clusters of white-pink flowers
